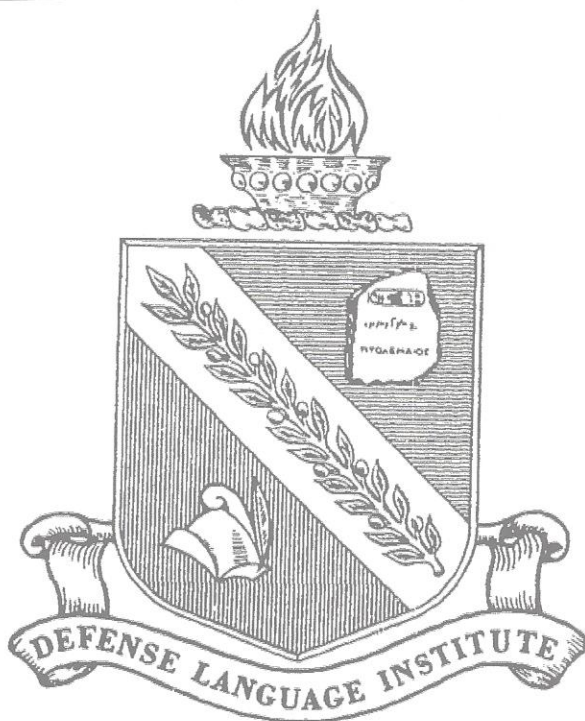

Note on Page Numbering:

MODULE 3

INTRODUCTION

Your third module deals with two situations in which you may find yourself: you want to order a meal in a restaurant and you want to chat with a German whose table you share in the restaurant. You will learn to express yourself in these two situations and understand what Germans would say to you.

You will be guided through, and asked to participate in two conversations. You will also learn to use certain common German expressions related to eating in a restaurant and to order some basic beverages and food items. Primarily, however, you will learn to read and understand entries on a German menu, to order these from a waiter or waitress and to understand what they might say to you. Consequently, much emphasis is placed on understanding the names of German dishes and drinks in print and their proper pronunciation.

UNIT I

OBJECTIVES

You will be able to:

- a. Use standard courtesy expressions in a restaurant.
- b. Ask for a menu and the check.
- c. Understand and pronounce German food items and beverages.
- d. Understand the meaning of entries on a German menu, and order what you want.
- e. Understand and respond to questions commonly asked by a waiter or waitress.
- f. Request items like a fork, knife, spoon, or napkin.
- g. Understand prices when you hear them.

*For politeness Germans use bitte sehr ("please") when handing something to you.
